VP Paul Havens brought the March 22nd meeting to order, thanked everyone for attending...and all stood to say the Pledge of Allegiance.

Secretary Mary Muys read off last months minutes. No corrections to be made.

Treasurer Dave Betts gave the account reports for both the Raffle and General Accounts. Reports are on file with the President and Secretary and the treasurer's report is available to any member, who would like to see it. All the Cart Sponsors have made their contributions (see page 3 for the List of Sponsors) and all carts have signs on them. Dave read off the few bills to be paid...and payment was approved. The status of the clubs 501c is still in the process of approval. For the 2019 Fair, Dave said he will be at the shed every night to count and confirm the totals against the register's printed receipt. Hopefully, this will require less hands to be involved, and everyone can get out of the building quicker and go home for the night. Per Dave, there are 28 members who have yet to pay their membership dues, and these will be notified with this months newsletter (see below). They will have until April 15th to pay otherwise they won't receive the newsletter or be part of club functions. The membership fee will stay at \$25 whether people join in January, August or November...to avoid any confusion going forward. Dave also suggested that we get a club banner, so that when we are in parades, the crowd knows who we are....other than just a bunch of people with tractors. Mary Muys also mention that we should have a custom tablecloth banner for selling peanuts outside our building, in an effort to be more appealing to on goers.

The members briefly talked about the possibility doing the monthly newsletter via email, vs. having them mailed, but would leave the option up to each member as they would prefer. More discussion on this at the next meeting.

Old business: Paul Havens said he, and Dave Betts, attended the 2019 State Fair Brain Storming Session, to further promote "new" ideas for Fair Events. One thought for us was to run the Oil Field Engine and the washing machines, with a verbal seminar and written hand-out on each. Further discussions included building demonstrations, seminars etc. around existing articles from former newsletters etc. Whatever we decide; if we get back to the Fair Committee in time (JUNE ?), with a description of our plan for seminars and/or demonstrations...they will post it in the NJ Herald (with the schedule) and on the Fair's Website and do a PA Announcement of each during the week of the Fair. We will need member involvement!

If there is a RED CHECK on the front page of your newsletter, our records indicate you have not paid your 2019 dues...call Dave Betts!

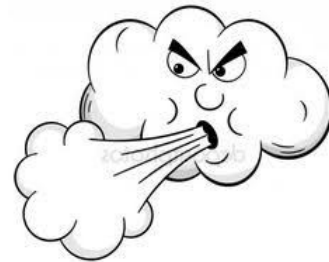
