# Four Cycle Hit-and-Miss Engine

As a 2nd in a series...Andy Mackey, club VP, put on a presentation on the club owned UNITED hit-and-miss engine. The UNITED, 1 1/2 HP, 4-cycle (Otto cycle) hit-and-miss engine...circa 1918...was manufactured in the early part of the 20th century by the UNITED ENGINE COMPANY of Lansing, Michigan. Of note; UNITED was an actual engine-builder and not a re-brander. These smaller engines were used to power butter churns, milking machines and grinders in the farming community and were very "fuel stingy" and efficient vs. their conventional throttle-governed cousins. On the down side... both large and small hit-and-miss engines have a wide fluctuation in engine speed and cannot be used to power generators or any machine or equipment that requires constant speed. The UNITED engine has a battery/coil fired make-and-break ignition vs. the low-tension magneto excited ignition, an ignitor vs. a sparkplug, a fuel mixer vs. a carburetor...and, as with all hit-and-miss engines, uses the inertia of its flywheels to do most of the work. These are heavy, simple engines, with an "open" crankcase design and with all the components of the engine visible and "exposed" to the elements...and dirt! The most intricate (technical) part of the engine is the "trip-rod", which connects to a fly-ball/spring governor and controls to both the ignitor and the exhaust valve...which it holds open (the "miss") whenever the engine is operating above its governed speed and thereby interrupts (stops) compression, vacuum and fuel intake. Cylinder lubrication is provided by an adjustable open-air or pressurized single-point drip lubricator and the balance of the engine is lubed by hand with either oil or grease. Lack of lubrication is a major problem with these engines and Andy strongly recommended pre-lubing the piston and wrist pin, connecting rod, crankshaft and all operating mechanisms prior to starting the engine. Andy also advised not running these engines too slow...always a concern in a display engine. At very low RPMs, the torsional vibration and piston-rod-crankshaft impact can damage, crack or break the crankshaft. While giving his presentation, Andy

noticed and noted several problems with our UNITED engine that will have to be addressed in the near future. Dave Betts used his newly acquired non-digital (old fashion) analog camcorder system to project Andy's presentation visually and real-time on a movie screen.
