Dave also pointed out that the *Frankford Main Library* has a machine that can print out banners for you, with many sizes to choose from and that are very reasonable. We may use them to get a banner or two for our club before the Fair.

Paul Havens talked about revisiting the clubs By-Laws and "creating a committee" to get it updated and to share it with the members.

A short discussion was held on upcoming events, including Plow Day on April 13th, with a rain date of the 20th, the Military Show & Swap Meet on April 27th and 28th and the Memorial Day Parade...note: post parade, we will line up the tractors in front of the Firehouse on Railroad Ave. and are again invited to stay for food and refreshments!




