Dave Betts read a resignation letter from Paul Bouscaren, who has resigned from the Club Treasurer Position as his job has taken him out of state...and he will no longer be able to handle the finances of the club. Dave will be the acting treasurer in the interim until the new elections. It was also suggested to take our accounts at Wells Fargo and close them out as they cost us a bit and are "not" business friendly. The recommendation from Dave Betts was to take everything to Chase or Lakeland as they will give us money for opening a new account and have better financial reporting.

As far as our 501 non-profit status, Dave Betts, Chuck Klim and Bob Triebel have been in contact with a CPA and are working at getting us reinstated. Whether we stay as our current named business or even change to another name, we would still have to file for our taxes from 2010 to 2017 to get a tax clearance certificate to close the company. And then start over with a new name, new state corporate filing, new registration, by-laws and then file for a new 1023 non profit request. It appears to be more trouble than it is worth and it further appears that everything will be straightened in due time and we will be back in good standing. There is also a consideration to having this CPA do our taxes for the next year or two until we get a good handle on everything.
